Elections Have Consequences



The Arizona Primary election is on August 26th and the General election is on **November 4th**, giving you two opportunities the change the political landscape in Arizona for several years to come. All legislative positions are open to challenge and whoever wins will affect legislation for the next two years. Additionally, a new Governor will be elected for a 4 year term.

In 430 B.C., the Greek Statesman Pericles said, "Just because you do not take an interest in politics doesn't mean that politics won't take an interest in you." Whether or not the new Legislature and Governor will work with AzCDL's representatives at the Capitol to restore and protect your Right to Keep and Bear Arms can depend on whether or not you took the time to cast your vote on August 26th and November 4th.

Avoiding the election is a vote for accepting the way things turn out, good or bad.

AzCDL members are activists, not spectators, and activism begins with voting. Because our members choose to get involved politically, we have made historic changes to Arizona's gun laws and become the model for other states to follow. But Arizona is far from being the perfect state for freely exercising the Right to Keep and Bear Arms. How much further we can advance your rights in the coming legislative sessions depends on who is elected to work with us. Make a difference and VOTE!

Silent Plinker Raffle



Get 'em before they're gone!

AzCDL is raffling off THREE sound suppressed pistol packages.

Each package includes a Ruger 22/45 .22 caliber pistol with threaded barrel, plus a Tactical Solutions Cascade sound suppressor. AzCDL will also pay the \$200 Federal Transfer Tax, required for suppressor ownership, for qualified winners

Tickets are \$10 each and only 900 tickets will be sold. Each raffle ticket represents 3 chances to win.

The winning tickets will be drawn at AzCDL's Annual Meeting, in Phoenix, on Saturday, October 11, 2014.



Winners do not have to be present to win.

Winners must comply with all federal, state, and local laws, and must pick up their firearm and suppressor from a federally licensed (FFL) firearms dealer.

If a winner does not qualify under federal, state, or local laws for the possession of the sound suppressor, only the firearm will be transferred and the winner waives all rights to the sound suppressor and associated transfer fees.

In some jurisdictions, possession of a firearm with a threaded barrel is illegal. In cases where we cannot transfer the Ruger 22/45 pistol, no substitution will be made and the winner waives all rights to the firearm.
